A guide to chartering Key Clubs worldwide

Starting a Key Club at your school or in your community is as easy as securing the four basic necessities:

SITE & SPONSOR

Key Clubs can be built at any high school, community center, church or anywhere else teenagers meet! Look for local Kiwanis clubs and seek their sponsorship. If they deny, don't worry; Key Clubs can always be chartered and grow successful without Kiwanis sponsorship. Don't forget to find an adult advisor to sign on to your new club.

MEMBERS

The heart of every Key Club is its membership base. These are the dedicated individuals who will do the service Key Club International has become famous. Fifteen chartering members are required, and shoot to have fewer than half of the original members graduating in the first year.

CHARTER

Obtaining a charter to become part of Key Club International is now easier than ever. Fees range from US\$400–600 in the United States and Canada, and vary worldwide. Find the necessary paperwork and additional information online at www.keyclub.org/startclub.

With charter in hand, there are a few final steps you should complete to ensure the long-term success of your club:

TRAIN

Without a clear example of club leadership nearby, it's important to have your club's chartering officers well trained in the beginning of their terms in office. Visit www.keyclub.org/fad/gov/cbd and contact your lieutenant governor to start the year off strong.
